Our Vision

Every death and life changing injury on Cambridgeshire and Peterborough's roads or to a Cambridgeshire or Peterborough resident is one too many, and the social and economic burden of road casualties is felt much wider than just those immediately involved in the collision.

Therefore, our vision is to prevent all road deaths across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough and to significantly reduce the severity of injuries and subsequent costs and social impacts from road traffic collisions.

Our Strategy

The Partnership's strategy has been developed based on stakeholder consultation and review of nationally and internationally adopted policies and frameworks.

A key aspect of our strategy is the recognition that the social and economic costs of road collisions extends to wider provision not previously associated with typical road safety programmes, such as victim support and rehabilitation and has therefore sought a new model for the delivery of an "holistic approach" to road safety.
